Rules & Regulations:

Single Class Entry Fee \$10 (based on rider).

Day Pass \$50 (unlimited classes) (ASAM Members \$45)

\$10 late fee (per horse) postmarked after April 18, 2010

(Day pass not good for MHA Medallion or Saddlebred Rescue Classes)

MHA Trophy Fee \$4/horse/pony Number fee \$1 nonrefundable

- You must enter all classes prior to the class in the office. This is a pointed show for ASAM & MHA. All entries in a class without entering in the office prior to the class are subject to a \$10 bandit fee.
- Any entries incurring bank fees will be charged \$50.00 plus cost of the fee.
- Refunds will be made upon receipt of a vet certificate (or Dr.) & must be received by show manager before end of show.
- Every Class recognized by MHA will be conducted and judged under the current rules of MHA.
- Six (6) ribbons awarded per class.
- A food vendor will be on grounds. Blue Ribbon Tack Shop will also be on grounds.
- The ASAM Inc. Show Committee, MHA or their agents or employees, and/or the Hollis Equestrian Park will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to rider, groom, attendant, spectator, animal, or equipment at the show. Nor will any of the aforementioned be held responsible for loss or destruction of any property or equipment or damage to or by animals at the Show or on the grounds.
- **WARNING:** Under Maine State Law an equine professional has limited liability for an injury or death resulting from the inherent risks of any equine activities.
- Post entries must be made a minimum of 3 classes prior to the entered class.
- No dogs on the show grounds unless kept on a leash away from the ring.
- No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on the show grounds.
- PROOF of current rabies, negative Coggins and registration papers (breed classes) will be required to show.
- All TWH Versatility classes herein which are covered by the rules and specs of the TWHBEA Versatility Program & NHSC current rule books will be conducted and judged in accordance therein.
- Show Clothes &/or fun attire allowed. Minimum: jods and heeled shoes required. Helmets required for hunter seat riders.

Getting to the Hollis Equestrian Park:

From the South via the Maine Turnpike:

Take Exit 25 (formerly Exit 3) in Kennebunk. Follow signs to Route 35 North. Stay on Route 35 through Kennebunk and Lyman. Turn left on Route 5 North in Dayton. Park is 2.5 miles on left.

From the North via the Maine Turnpike:

Take Exit 46 (formerly Exit 7B) in South Portland. Turn left out of the toll booth and then left onto Route 22 West. Take Route 22 through Westbrook, Scarborough, Gorham and into Buxton. Turn left on Route 202 South into Hollis Center. Turn left, heading South, on Route 35. Turn right on Clark's Mills Road. At the end of Clark's Mills road, turn left on Route 5. Park is immediately on your right.

ACADEMY DIVISION RULES

Riders in this division are students who are currently taking riding lessons and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. The age of the rider must be listed on the entry blank. Headers for Lead Line riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses that are used are to be LESSON HORSES. Horses are not to be judged (See Horse Eligibility). Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be minimum holds allowed, please be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called. There will be a 2 minute gate call per class.

Rider Eligibility: A rider MAY NOT enter in any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division class or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating further in the Academy Division, with the exception of the Show Rider Classes. Once a rider has competed at ANY level wearing a full suit, they are ineligible to compete in Academy classes at any point thereafter. The rider can however compete in Show Rider Classes in the season(s) following the season in which the rider showed wearing a full suit.

Horse Eligibility: Academy mounts must be Lesson Horses. A Lesson Horse is a horse or pony that is REGULARLY used in a lesson program to teach a number of different riders in any given week. Braiding is optional. There are no shoeing restrictions. Protective boots are permissible. Horses may cross-enter from the regular horse show to Academy classes, provided these horses are School Horses as defined above. Academy mounts may be shown in a snaffle bridle (martingales allowed), Pelham, or full bridle. This division is open to all breeds of horses and ponies.

Attire: Helmets approved for horseback riding (not bicycle helmets) are encouraged for all exhibitors but are not mandatory. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

Saddle Seat: Kentucky Jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and tie. Vest and gloves are optional. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

Hunt Seat: Hunter style jodhpurs, jodhpur boots or paddock boots, shirt and tie or choker, and helmets. Adults may wear breeches and boots. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

Western Seat: Western jeans or slim-fitting pants, long-sleeve shirt. Ties and chaps are optional. NO western hats are allowed.

Open to all horses/ponies who do not yet canter in shows. To show at a walk & trot/jog/alternative gait both ways of the ring. Will not be asked to back. To be judged on 50% conformation and 50% manners and way of going.

23. Open Pair Class** One entry fee per team or per horse.

Two entries to show side by side at a walk, trot/jog/alternative gait & canter/lope both ways of the ring. To be judged on manners and performance. Not to be judged on the horses' looking similar.)
